



Cancer Education for Teens

Cancer Education for Teens is an interactive course that has been developed in collaboration with experts in the field of oncology, cancer support, and public health to raise teen awareness about cancer risk factors. It has been delivered to more than 50,000 high school students in Washington State, to date, as part of their health education classes. The course provides teens with education on:

- What is cancer and who gets it
- Understanding the risk factors for cancer
- Ways to reduce cancer risk
- Supporting those with cancer

Cancer Education for Teens can be incorporated into the classroom as homework, with the opportunity for an interactive classroom discussion. Instructors can also teach directly from the online curriculum, providing a comprehensive lesson with all of the preparation complete. Schools, youth groups, and civic organizations are ideal partners for the delivery of Cancer Education for Teens.
